Sports Premium

Ian Jackson's time and knowledge was purchased with this money. We are members of the local sports partnership which gives us entitlement to lots of benefits including:

Coaching courses for staff, arranged competitions and tournaments, reduced transport fees, reduced resources through Maude sport, 4 x 6 hour coaching sessions for a range of sports. Ian is an excellent bank of knowledge and will always ensure high quality coaches are offered.

Lines were painted on the playground to help with netball positions. At last years tournament our pupils had never played on a 'proper' marked court and this had a huge effect on the result. This year they will be prepared and these court markings are a permanent feature. Also, two new fixed basketball posts were added and allows for more pupils to practice shooting within a lesson.....resulting in more active children.

Specialist coaches for class and after-school clubs are paid out of the sports premium. Bollywood Dance, Football, Street Dance.

Pupils wear a Glade T-shirt which was purchased with this money when representing the school in competition. Pupils had previously mentioned feeling 'scruffy' compared to other schools and this has improved their sense of pride.

All pupils in KS2 are issued with a team coloured T-shirt for competition and PE lessons. Pupils can easily be identified in their teams and it saves time in lessons (keeps them active for longer) without spending time handing out bibs for games.

Transport to competitions and tournaments (including G&T workshops).

The school has an excellent bank of equipment thanks to the sports premium. Pupils are more active as a result as they do not have to share (footballs, basketballs).

Supply cover is paid for when teachers are released to observe KH each term. This helps them to improve their own professional development and gain ideas

for their own teaching. Feedback has been positive from EJ (NQT) who felt more confident to teach her own class after her observation.

Impact of SSP at Glade

Increased pupil confidence (when representing the school).

More active PE lessons (equipment).

Access to more competitions and Gifted and Talented workshops through the partnership.

Specialist coaches hired in response to pupil survey conducted in the Summer Term (Street Dance). Last year, cricket, rounders.

Sports Café

The first sports café has been booked for 10th November 2014. Parents of children in Herons Class will be invited to join in with a basketball lesson from 2-3pm. Posters and letters will be sent out after half-term. We will also trial this in KS1 with Laura Guggiari's class (TBA).

I am hoping for a good response which may encourage parents to be more interested in sending their children to after-school clubs and helping with transport to and from fixtures (this has been a big issue in the past).

*** 20 parents attended golf (Year 3) with 4 children being offered expert coaching with their parents at weekends.**

Celebrating achievement

Every week, KH chooses the class which has the best PE kit record. Their class name is displayed on the PE board for the whole week and announced in assembly.

Also, the class with the best sportsmanship is mentioned and an example given for why it has been awarded. This too is displayed on the PE board.

In the Hall there is a PE board which displays levels for the pupils. I have made this in 'child speak' so that the pupils can understand their targets. We also display newspaper clippings (currently football) which involve Glade children and celebrate success in school tournaments to tell the rest of the school

Certificates are awarded to every pupil who represents the school in competition, and all children who finish 1st, 2nd or 3rd on sports day receive a medal and certificate.

Sports superstars are photographed for the PE board in the hall holding their trophies, medals and certificates. Also, good examples of written work from Healthy Living lessons and dance evaluations are displayed.

Gifted and Talented

Through the sports partnership, those pupils identified as G&T attend workshops at least twice a year.

G&T pupils are encouraged to play a teaching role in most PE lessons. They help with refereeing small games, help to explain and introduce tactics to their small sided games. (Level 4/5 children have an awareness of tactics and can encourage others to follow suit).

Three boys were invited to attend trials for Ipswich Town Football Club. Two of these children did attend the trials over the summer holidays and made it through to the next round. This has really improved their confidence and behaviour as they have been told they cannot compete at a high level with the wrong attitude.

I have created a list of all pupils from Year 2 - 6 who attend any local after-school clubs to establish links with their coaches. This allows me to contact coaches to find out about local competition and track progress of their learning in PE during their own time.
