Job vacancies

We have 2 vacancies for Mid-day Supervisors. Hours are 11.55am—1.05pm, Monday to Friday, term time only. Pay is £6.44 per hour.

Please ask at the school office if you are interested. Full training will be provided, and you will be required to take a CRB check.

Attendance

Like all schools, we are under a lot of government scrutiny to improve attendance. This means that the school is judged on the amount of absence children take. This is why we send reminders to parents if a child's attendance drops to below 90%. This term, the governors have received a directive from Suffolk County Council instructing them to question the school on what is being done to improve attendance. Every child is different and some may have more illness than others, but 90% attendance means that a child is absent for one day every two weeks. This would mean missing 4 weeks of school over the year, which is a huge amount.

This focus on attendance is national. It was reported in the press last week of a family that was fined over £900 because they took a week's holiday in term time. www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-england-shropshire-25733272

These rules come from national government and we are obliged to follow them. Expected attendance is at least 95% which equates to 9 days of absence per year. When attendance drops below 90% we are obliged to take action. If attendance drops to 85%, the Educational Welfare Officer becomes involved.

Breakfast Club

Glade Primary School now run a breakfast club, which is open to all Glade pupils.
Club runs from 7.45am till 8.50am daily.

For regular bookings, the cost is **£3** per session, payable in advance and bookings can be made through the school office.

For last-minute bookings (less than 24 hours before the session), the cost is **£3.50** per session, payable in advance.

Children will receive a healthy breakfast, and be able to take part in a range of activities, including board games, using the school computers/iPads and getting help with their homework.

**Breakfast club can be booked through the school office from this week.
All sessions must be paid for in advance.**
